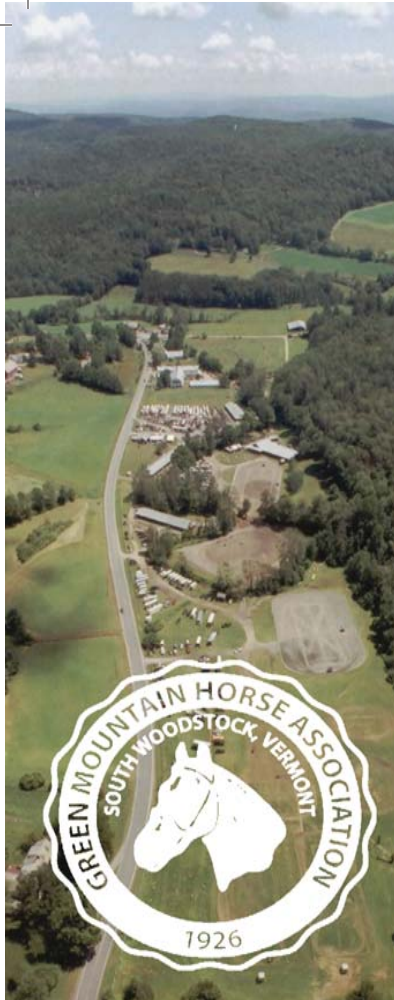

## GMHA Today

The Green Mountain Horse Association, founded in 1926, is the nation's oldest continuously operating horse association. Located in the heart of Vermont's Green Mountains, GMHA offers clinics and competitions in a variety of equestrian disciplines, including dressage, driving, eventing, hunter/jumper, and trail riding. GMHA is dedicated to preserving and protecting riding trails and open spaces for equestrian use, including our extensive trail network which covers over 500 miles.

Facilities include newly renovated permanent stabling for 150 horses, temporary stabling for up to 200 horses, four all-weather rings, extensive grass riding areas, driving obstacles and a cross-country course that runs through Preliminary. Also on site are a newly renovated meeting room, Visitor's Center, and a cafe.

**From April to October, GMHA hosts more than 65 events, accommodating 3,500 horses and approximately 10,000 visitors.**
