GMHA Schooling Shows

Rules, Policies, and Notes:

All classes will award ribbons 1st-6th place. Games classes to be awarded at the judge's discretion.

There will be no longeing allowed in warm-up area during show hours. Longeing will be allowed in separate grass area on grounds, and before the start of competition in the show warm-up.

Formal attire and braiding is encouraged but not required. Horse and rider tack/attire should be clean and tidy with a good fit.

Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes as entries warrant, and change the show schedule as it deems necessary.

Equitation divisions will be split (children's/ adult amateur) if entries warrant.

Vet and farrier will be on-call, EMT on-grounds.

Horses may only be ridden by those who have signed the appropriate entry blank.

No charge to add or scratch a class before the class begins. Scratches not accepted after the start of a class.

Rider is responsible for reading and understanding class specifications. Please contact Karey with any questions.

USEF rules will be used as guidelines for all areas not specifically addressed in rules or class specifications. Please see www.usef.org.

Class Specifications

Leadline: Open to riders age 9 and under. To be shown at the walk, with short trot/jog. Not to cross-enter into any other class except Costume Class, Walk/Trot Pin Drop, Walk/Trot Barrel Race.

Equitation: To be shown at the walk, trot/jog, or canter/lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on hands, seat, and control of mount. May be asked to back.

Pleasure: To be shown at the walk, trot/jog, or canter/lope both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. To be judged on performance, manners, soundness, and the horse/pony's suitability to serve as a pleasure mount.

Open: Open to riders of all seats. To be shown at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope both ways of the ring.

Beginner: Open to riders 12 years of age and under who have not competed in any class requiring canter. To be asked to walk and trot/jog ONLY both ways of the ring. May not cross-enter into any class requiring canter.

Advanced Beginner: Open to all riders- MAY NOT CROSS ENTER into any other equitation division, or class requiring a canter. May show in walk/trot games classes, Costume Class, and Grooming and Showmanship. Riders to show at the walk, trot/jog, and to canter/lope one at a time or in small groups.

Hunter Hack 18": To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Also to be shown individually over two simple fences not to exceed 18". To be judged on performance, soundness, and the suitability of the horse to be a hunter.

Equitation Divisions

Short/Long Stirrup Equitation: Open to riders 12 years of age and under (Short Stirrup) or riders 13 years of age or older (Long Stirrup) who have not competed over 2'6". MAY BE SPLIT IF ENTRIES WARRANT. May not cross-enter into other equitation division, or any classes with fences exceeding 2'3". To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter on the flat- no more than 8 riders to canter at one time. Course to consist of 4-8 cross-rails not to exceed 18". Simple changes acceptable.

Modified Children's/Adult Amateur Equitation 2'-2'3": For juniors and adult amateur riders- MAY BE SPLIT IF ENTRIES WARRANT. Not to cross-enter into any other class where fences exceed 2'6". To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring on the flat. Fences not to exceed 2'3".

Children's/Adult Amateur Equitation 2'6"-2'9": Open to junior and adult amateur riders- MAY BE SPLIT IF ENTRIES WARRANT. May not cross-enter into any other equitation division. To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter on the flat. Fences not to exceed 2'9".

Class Specifications Continued...

Jumper Classes

Table II, 1: Fastest clear round wins the class. No jump off.

Table II, 2b: Rounds with no faults (jumping or time) stay in the ring after completing the course. When the judge signals, rider immediately begins jump off round.

Puddle Jumper: Open to all riders. May not cross-enter into any class where fences exceed 2'6" at the same show. Fences not to exceed 2'3".

Elementary Jumper: Open to all riders. May not cross-enter into any class where fences exceed 2'9" at the same show. Fences not to exceed 2'6"

Schooling Jumper: Open to all riders. Fences not to exceed 3'.

Low Jumper: Open to all riders. Fences not to exceed 3'3".

Open Jumper: Open to all riders. Fences not to exceed 3'6".

Fun and Games

Walk/Trot Egg & Spoon: To be judged at walk/trot, balancing an egg on a spoon. Competitor is eliminated when egg falls, class continues until one competitor remains.

Simon Says: to be judged at walk/trot, Judged on the horse and rider's ability to follow the announcer's instructions. Judge calls out commands (change of gait, direction, halt, reinback, etc.), exhibitor must obey commands only IF "Simon Says". Class continues until one horse remains.

Open Command Class: Judged on the horse and rider's ability to follow commands of the judge. Judge calls out commands (change of gait, direction, halt, reinback, etc.), exhibitor must obey within the count of 3. Class continues until one horse remains.

Open Egg & Spoon: Similar to above egg & spoon class but will include canter/lope during class.

Pleasure Pairs: Pairs of riders to show side by side at the walk, trot/jog, and/or canter/lope. To be judged on performance, manners, soundness, and ability of the pair to work as a team.

Obstacle Class: To be shown individually over a course of 6-8 trail obstacles (may include mailbox, bridge, backing over rails, cones, small jump.) Map will be posted prior to class.

Pin Drop: walk/trot division and open division: A timed competition- individual races to the end of the ring, picks up a bowling pin (placed on a barrel), runs back and must drop it in a bucket. 10 second penalty for missing the bucket. Fastest time wins.

Barrel Race: walk/trot division & open division: A timed competition- individual races to the end of the ring, around one or more barrels, and back across start/finish line. Fastest time wins. map will be posted prior to class.

Ride a Buck: Riders will enter the class bareback (no saddle, saddle pad, or bareback pads allowed). Each rider provides a dollar bill, which is placed under the riders' seat or thigh (judge's choice). Riders must walk, trot/jog, and/or canter/lope- when the dollar falls, rider is eliminated and will stand in the center of the ring. Class proceeds until only one rider remains- winning rider takes home all of the dollars!

Costume Class: Can be shown with or without a lead. Costumes on riders and/or horses or both- just for fun!

GMHA Show Rules & Regulations

Rules and Regulations apply to all GMHA Hunter/Jumper Shows.

ENTRIES

- Fees made payable to GMHA. Checks, money orders, cash, and Visa/Mastercard are accepted.
- Online entries are accepted and encouraged- please go to www.showgroundslive.com.
- Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes as entries warrant, change the show schedule as it deems necessary, and substitute officials.
- Opportunity classes are exempt from USEF fees.
- Please note that all horses must obtain and submit a Horse ID number from USEF.
- Scratches: There is no penalty to scratch a class, or add a class during the show, as long as it is done by filling out a scratch/add form in the show secretary's office PRIOR to the start of the class. No refunds will be given if a ride is scratched after the class has begun. \$40 entry scratch fee for entered horse and rider combinations.
- Bandit Riders: Anyone found showing in classes in which they have not been entered with the show secretary's office will be charged double the entry fee. Add/Scratch forms are available.
- No wait list. Entries are accepted on show day, but will be charged the post entry fee.
- Non-competing horses allowed on grounds: MUST fill out entry form, pay office & USEF fees, & wear a number at all times.
- Order of go for all classes will be determined by signing up at the in-gate.

AWARDS

- Trophy and ribbons through 8th place in each class.
- Division Champions & Reserve Champions receive a ribbon and trophy.
- Ties for other than first place in a jumper class will be broke by a coin toss.
- GMHA Mini-Prix prize money to be awarded as follows: 1st place- \$150, 2nd place- \$100, 3rd place- \$50.

STABLING

- 150 NEWLY RENOVATED 10'x10' permanent box stalls, all with solid doors and rubber mats. 40 temporary 10'x10' stalls. Tack stalls available. No bedding is provided; may pre-purchase shavings/hay or bring with you. Nightwatch on grounds.

- Stalls are to be stripped upon departure. Will be billed \$50 for dirty stall.

FOOTING

- Sand rings for competition and warm-up. Dust Bowl: 240'x180', Upwey Warm-Up: 120'x280'.
- Lunging area is on grass.
- Competition Rings are approximately 120'x280' (White Ring) and 150'x268' (Walker Ring), 240'x180' (Upwey Ring).

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Woodstock Town Zoning PROHIBITS CAMPING OF ANY KIND on GMHA Grounds. Violators will be required to leave the show grounds.
- For accommodations listing, see our website, www.gmhainc.org.

OTHER

- Concessions available on-grounds during show hours.
- EMT, Farrier & Vet on-grounds during show. Veterinarian on-call outside of show hours. Phone numbers will be posted in the show program and the show office. Emergency number is 911.
- Strict Dog Policy – Pets must be leashed at all times. \$30 fee for each off-leash occurrence.
- Horses may only be ridden by riders, trainers, coaches, and owners who have signed the entry blank.
- Pony Measuring – show secretary must be notified 48 hours PRIOR to the start of the show. No exceptions.
- Anyone operating a motorized vehicle must have a valid driver's license.

DIRECTIONS

- From West: N.Y. Thruway to I-87 Northway to Exit 20. Take Rt. 149 to Fort Ann, then Rt. 4 to Rutland & Woodstock. Take Rt. 106 (at Woodstock Inn) South 5 miles to GMHA.
- From South: I-91 to Ascutney exit 8. Take Rt. 131 west to Rt. 106 North, 12 miles to GMHA.
- From East: I-89 to Exit 1 in Vermont. Take Rt. 4 into Woodstock, circle around the Woodstock Green, and take Rt. 106 (at Woodstock Inn) South 5 miles to GMHA.

- First round: Classic course consisting of 8 traditional hunt-type obstacles not to exceed class height. Fences to simulate those found on an outside hunt course,- may include post and rail, walls, logs, coops, brush, and hedges. Water crossing may be included.
- Second round: Hand course of at least 10 fences not to exceed class height. Option fences may be set 3" higher than class height.

Schedule

- 2'6" division will compete first, followed by 3' division. Start time determined by number of entries.
- Second round will run in reverse order of placing based on first round scores.
- Paid schooling in the hunter derby field will be scheduled on the morning of the competition, if conditions permit. Note: This will be a FLAT SCHOOLING ONLY- NO JUMPING the course prior to competition. Fields will be open for hacking only. Jumping any course obstacles during schooling WILL RESULT IN ELIMINATION.
- Schooling will be allowed in the MORNING ONLY- NO SCHOOLING ONCE COMPETITION BEGINS.
- During and prior to competition, warm-up rounds are available over the hunt course in the Walker Ring. Solid, cross-country type obstacles similar to those on course will be available for schooling in the Dust Bowl throughout the day.
- Start times and order of go will be posted on our website by August 15.
- Luau will begin at 5pm regardless of competition schedule.

Awards

- Prize money to be awarded as follows: 1st place \$300, 2nd place \$125, 3rd place \$75.
- Ribbons will be awarded through 10th place in each division. Mounted awards ceremony to follow each division for top 10 participants.

Pleasure to be judged on manners, suitability, performance, and quality. Over fences to be shown over 4 cross-rails not to exceed 12"- to be judged as an equitation class. ASPCA HORSEMANSHIP CLASS: Open to Junior Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Rider and trainer must be current members of the ASPCA/NHSAA, and must show their ASPCA numbers on the entry blank. Junior rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer annual contribution shall be \$50. Fees should be payable and sent directly to the National Horse Show Association of America, P.O. Box 386, Greenvale, NY 11548. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences at 3'6" with or without wings. A minimum of twelve riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. The Under Saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. Only one rider per horse. USEF Tests 1-19. To fill a class six competitors must complete the course.

BABY GREEN HUNTER: Open to all horses and ponies in their first or second year of showing. Fences not to exceed 2'6". NOT VHJA RATED.

BEGINNER: Opportunity classes will follow same specifications (no fees apply): Open to riders 10 years of age and under who have not previously competed in any class requiring canter, lope or hand gallop. To be asked to walk and trot ONLY both ways of the ring. Children riding in this class are not eligible to ride in any class in the show, which requires a canter. trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse/pony's mouth is required. To be judged on manners, performance, quality, presence and soundness. No martingales or dropped nosebands are permitted. NEHC 'C' Rated.

INTERMEDIATE EQUITATION: Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders 17 years old and under. Not to have won 12 blue ribbons in an equitation class over 3'3" or higher at a USEF recognized show. To be shown over a course of at least 6 fences not to exceed 3'3".

INTERMEDIATE WORKING HUNTER: Open to all horses. Fences not to exceed 3'3". To be judged on performance and soundness.

LEADLINE: Open to riders eight years old and under to be led by an adult on foot. Walk and trot/jog a few steps only.

LIMIT EQUITATION: Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders 17 years old and under. Not to have won 6 blue ribbons in an equitation class at a USEF recognized show. Flat to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. (USEF Tests 1- 7). O/F to be shown over a course of at least 6 fences at 3'.

LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION: Open to riders 13 years of age and older who have not competed over fences exceeding 26" in the current show season or over 2' at the same show. No more than 8 entries to canter at one time in flat class. O/F class will include a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'. Simple changes will be deemed acceptable. No combinations or oxers. Cross rails are acceptable.

LONG STIRRUP HUNTER: As above, but to be judged on performance and soundness.

LOW JUMPER: Open to all horses and ponies of any breed or height. To be shown over a course of at least 8 jumps 3' to 3'3" with spreads not to exceed the height of the fences. USEF Table 11. NOT VHJA RATED.

LOW MODIFIED HUNTER: Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fence height 2'3"-2'6". To be judged on performance and soundness. NOT VHJA RATED.

LOW WORKING HUNTER: Open to all horses. Fence Height 2'9" to 3'0". To be judged on performance and soundness.

MAIDEN EQUITATION: Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders 17 years old and under. Not to have won 1 blue ribbon in an equitation class at a USEF recognized show. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. (USEF Tests 1). O/F to be shown over a course of at least 6 fences at 2'6".

MARSHALL & STERLING ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER CLASSIC: Open to all horses and ponies ridden by adult amateur riders. Fences not to exceed 3'. 3 riders must complete the course for points to count. Rider need not be a member of M&S to compete, but points will only be awarded to horses ridden by members. If fewer than 8 entries in Childrens or Adult Classic, classes may be combined. To be run as a two round class, first round designated as class #151.

MARSHALL & STERLING ADULT MEDAL: Open to Adult and Amateur Riders. To be shown over minimum of 8 fences at 3' including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE CLASSIC: Open to all horses and ponies ridden by junior riders eligible for Children's Hunter. Fences not to exceed 3'. 3 riders must complete the course for points to count. Rider need not be a member of M&S to compete, but points will only be awarded to horses ridden by members. If fewer than 8 entries in Childrens or Adult Classic, classes may be combined. To be run as a two round class, first round designated as class #156.

MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL - HORSE: Open to Junior Riders who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3' 3". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence.

Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY CLASSIC: Open to all horses and ponies ridden by junior riders eligible for Children's Hunter. Fences not to exceed 2'6" for large ponies, 2' for small and medium ponies. 3 riders must complete the course for points to count. Rider need not be a member of M&S to compete, but points will only be awarded to horses ridden by members. To be run as a two round class, first round designated as class #95.

MARSHALL & STERLING CHILDREN'S MEDAL - PONY (2' sm/med, 2'6" large): Open to Junior Riders who are not competing at the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3' 3". To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences the required height including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. To fill the class, three riders must complete the course. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

MARSHALL & STERLING JUNIOR MEDAL: Open to Junior Riders. To be shown over minimum of 8 fences at 3' 6" including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count. The rider must be a member in order for points to count toward qualifying for the Finals.

NEHC CHILDREN'S/ADULT AMATEUR LOW JUMPER: Open to exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year and to Amateur Adult riders. Fences not to exceed 3'3", spreads not to exceed 3'6". Horse/rider combination showing in jumper classes where fences are over 3'6" are not eligible for Childrens/Adult Amateur Classes. Table II. NEHC "C" Rated.

NEHC JUNIOR HUNTER SEAT MEDAL CLASS: All exhibitors must present a valid membership card before the class. Once a contestant has qualified, they are no longer eligible for the qualifying classes. Open to Junior members of the New England Horseman's Council who have not reached their 18th birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not exceeding 3'3". One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. One win required to qualify for the finals. USEF Tests 1-19.

NEHC ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER SEAT MEDAL: All exhibitors must present a valid membership card before the class. Open to adult amateur members of the New England Horseman's Council. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences not to exceed 3'. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. To fill a class, at least four competitors must complete the course. USEF Tests 1-19.

NEHC OPEN PLEASURE CLASS: Open to members and non-members. Open to all horses ordinarily used for pleasure purposes with no limitations as to the status of the rider or place of residence. To be shown at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope. Will be required to back. Shall be judged on manners, performance and quality in that order. Loose rein on command of judge only but without loss of contact. NEHC "C" Rated.

NEW HAMPSHIRE ADULT MEDAL: Fences not to exceed 2'9". Amateur riders 18 years of age and older must accumulate 12 points in order to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. At least three (3) riders must complete the course. Testing is optional and is at the discretion of the judge. USEF Tests 1-18. Note: When rider wins medal class at year-end finals, he/she must skip one (1) year of competing in the class at the finals, but may return to compete in the class the following year.

NEW HAMPSHIRE JUNIOR MEDAL: Fences not to exceed 3'. Junior riders must accumulate 12 points in order to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. At least three (3) riders must complete the course. Testing is optional and is at the discretion of the judge. USEF Tests

1-18. Note: When rider wins medal class at year-end finals, the rider no longer eligible to compete in the class and must move up to the New Hampshire Adult Medal.

NEW HAMPSHIRE PONY MEDAL: Fences not to exceed 2'3" for small & medium ponies and 2'6" for large ponies. Junior pony riders must accumulate 12 points in order to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. At least three (3) riders must complete the course. Testing is optional and is at the discretion of the judge. USEF Tests 1-18. Note: When rider wins medal class at year-end finals, the rider is no longer eligible to compete in the class again and must move up to the New Hampshire Junior Medal.

NEW HAMPSHIRE CHILDREN'S MEDAL: Fence heights not to exceed 2'3". Junior riders who have not shown over 2'6" at a recognized show must accumulate 12 points to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. At least three (3) riders must complete the course. Testing is optional and is at the discretion of the judge. USEF Tests 1-18. Note: When rider wins medal class at year-end finals two (2) years consecutively, the rider must move up to the New Hampshire Junior Medal class.

NEW HAMPSHIRE MODIFIED ADULT MEDAL: Fence heights not to exceed 2'3". Amateur riders 18 years of age and older who haven't shown over 2'6" at a recognized show must accumulate 12 points to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. At least three (3) riders must complete the course. Testing is optional and is at the discretion of the judge. USEF Tests 1-18. Note: When rider wins medal class at year-end finals two (2) years consecutively, the rider must move up to the New Hampshire Adult Medal class.

NEW HAMPSHIRE NOVICE MEDAL: Fence heights not to exceed 18". Junior and adult riders not having shown over 18" must accumulate 12 points to qualify. Riders will be required to perform over a minimum of 8 fences with at least one change of direction. At least three (3) riders must complete the course. Testing is optional and is at the discretion of the judge. USEF Tests 1-18. Note: When rider wins medal class at year-end finals, he/she is no longer eligible to compete in the class again. Rider must move up to New Hampshire Children's Medal or New Hampshire 2'3" Modified Amateur Adult Medal depending upon rider's age during competition year.

NOVICE EQUITATION: Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders 17 years old and under. Not to have won 3 blue ribbons in an equitation class at a USEF recognized show. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. (USEF Tests 1-7). O/F to be shown over a course of at least 6 fences at 2'9".

OPEN EQUITATION 11 & UNDER: Open to juniors who have not reached their 12th birthday. O/F to be shown over at least 6 fences not to exceed 2'6". Flat to be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. (USEF Tests 1-8). Only one horse/pony per rider. NEHC "C" Rated. **May not cross-enter into Children's Equitation.**

OPEN EQUITATION 12-14: Open to juniors who have reached their 12th birthday, but not their 15th. O/F to be shown over at least 6 fences not to exceed 3'. The course must include 1 combination, which includes an oxer, and 2 changes of direction after the 1st fence. One horse per rider. Flat to be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring (USEF Tests 1-8). NEHC "C" Rated. **May not cross-enter into Children's Equitation.**

OPEN EQUITATION 15-17: Open to juniors who have reached their 15th birthday but not their 18th. O/F to be shown over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'6". Course must include 1 combination, which includes an oxer, and 2 changes of direction after the first fence. One horse per rider. Flat to be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring (USEF Tests 1-19). NEHC "C" Rated. **May not cross-enter into Children's Equitation.**

OPEN JUMPER: Open to all horses and ponies of any breed or height. To be shown over a course of at least eight jumps 3'6" with a maximum spread of 3'6". USEF Table 11 Sec 2(a-c). NEHC 'C' Rated.

OPPORTUNITY BEGINNER: See "Beginner" specifications.

OPPORTUNITY ADVANCED BEGINNER: See "Advanced Beginner" specifications.

OPPORTUNITY LOW JUMPER: See "Low Jumper" specifications.

OPPORTUNITY PUDDLE JUMPER: See "Puddle Jumper" specifications.

PONY JUMPER: Open to Junior Riders. Open to ponies of any breed, height, and sex. Pony/rider may not cross enter into any other jumper class where fences exceed 2'6". To be shown over a course of at least 8 fences 2'-2'3", spreads not to exceed fence height. Table II. Ties other than first place will be broken by time taken to complete the course.

PRE-CHILDREN'S HUNTER: Open to horses & ponies (stallions prohibited). To be ridden by Junior riders who still qualify as a novice rider as of December 1 of previous year. Riders may show in this division for two show seasons. Fences not to exceed 2'3" No in & out. Riders may not cross enter into Children's Hunter or any other class that exceeds 2'6". To be shown over a course of six to eight fences not to exceed 2'3".

PUDDLE JUMPER: Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Horse and rider combination not to show over 2'6" at the same show. USEF Table II.

SCHOOLING JUMPER: Open to all horses and ponies. To be shown over a course of at least eight jumps at 2'9"-3' with spreads not to exceed the height of the fences. USEF Table 11.

SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION: Open to riders 12 years of age and under who are not to compete in any other equitation class at any show and have not competed in a jumping class over 18" in height. Flat: To be judged at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. No more than eight riders to canter at one time. May be asked to halt and back. Over fences class will include a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 8 fences not to exceed 18". Simple changes will be deemed acceptable. NEHC 'C' Rated
SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER: Same specifications as Short Stirrup Equitation. Shall be judged on performance and soundness. NEHC 'C' Rated.

SPECIAL WORKING HUNTER: HORSE section open to all horses. PONY section open to junior riders or any age riding ponies. Sections combined at the Spring Show. Fence height 2'6". No in and out. To be judged on performance and soundness.

USEF HUNTER SEAT MEDAL: Open to Junior Active Members of USEF who have not reached their 18th birthday. To be shown over a course of not less than 8 obstacles at 3'6" which must include one combination including an oxer and two changes of direction after the first obstacle. Two or more tests (USEF 1-19) are required of the top four competitors. Any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those exhibitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing, they will be placed at the judge's discretion. Only one rider per horse. To fill a class six competitors must complete the course.

USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH MEDAL: Competitors must use the same horse in both phases. Competitors may ride stallions. The jumping phase of the class shall be held first over a course of at least ten fences from 3'7" to 3'9" (1.10 - 1.15m.) in height with spreads to 4'11" (1.50m.). Each course must contain no fewer than three fences set at 3'9" (1.15m.) in height. The course must include a double and a triple combination, or 3 doubles. Additional spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. The course should be of the type used in a Junior Jumper class. Time allowed will be figured at 350 meters per minute; may be timed either electronically or manually. To be judged on style and execution. Time and jumping faults should be taken into consideration in the judge's evaluation of the rider. Two refusals will incur elimination. At least 12 riders, if available, must be called back for the flat phase. In the flat phase, riders will show as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders being considered for an award shall be required to show the working canter on the counter lead for at least one full revolution of the arena in both directions, but not more than 12 shall counter canter at one time. Judges may require any additional tests. To be judged on rider's position and seat and the correctness and effect of the aids. All riders must ride in the jumping phase, which will be offered first and will constitute entry into the class as a whole, regardless of whether the rider is called back for the second, flat phase. To fill a class, SIX COMPETITORS MUST COMPLETE THE COURSE.

VHJA ADULT MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to amateur

riders over 18 and who are members of the VHJA. To be held over a course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 3'. Two changes of hand (change of lead) and a combination, including an oxer are required. One or more tests of the top 4 contestants are required. USEF Tests 1- 19. The same horse must be used in all phases.

VHJA MODIFIED ADULT MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to adult amateur riders. Riders may not cross enter into any class that exceeds 2'9" at the same show. To be shown over a course of at least 8 fences; HIGH not to exceed 2'9", MED not to exceed 2'6", LOW not to exceed 2'3". Two changes of direction required after the first fence. No in and out. Sections will be pinned as one class. To be judged using the numeric scoring system. If entries warrant, class may be run at one height (2'6") at the show manager's discretion.

VHJA JOHN P. CORLEY HORSEMANSHIP MEDAL CLASS: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday and who are members of the VHJA. All contestants are required to perform over at least 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" with or without wings. A minimum of 8 riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of the horse. The under saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. Only one rider per horse. USEF Tests 1-19. Riders who win the final twice are no longer eligible to compete in this class.

VHJA JUNIOR MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday and who are members of the VHJA. To be held over a course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 3'. Two changes of hand (changes of lead) and a combination, including an oxer are required. One or more tests of the top 4 contestants are required. USEF Tests 1-19. Riders who win the finals twice are no longer eligible to compete in this class. Riders may not cross-enter into the President's Medal.

VHJA LONG STIRRUP MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to riders who are 13 years and older who are members of the VHJA, and who are eligible for a Long Stirrup Equitation Class. To be shown over a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8 fences not exceeding 2' in height, spread not to exceed height, with one of the following options to be part of the course: a bending line or rollback turn. No combinations. Simple changes will be deemed acceptable.

VHJA NOVICE MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday, who are members of the VHJA and in their first or second year of showing in medal classes in which the entry is not required to jump higher than 3'. The same rider/pony combination cannot compete in both the Novice and Pony Medal classes at the same show. Riders are also not to cross-enter into the VHJA Junior Medal. All riders are to compete over a course of a minimum of six fences at a height not to exceed 2'6", spread not to exceed height, no in and out. One or more tests are required of the top 4-6 riders. USEF tests 1-8. Riders who win the finals twice are no longer eligible to compete in this class.

VHJA PONY MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday and who are members of the VHJA on ponies who are 14.2 hands and under. No junior over 12 years of age may compete on a small pony. No junior over 14 years of age may compete on a medium pony. Riders entered in this class cannot cross enter into any class with fences exceeding 3' at the same show. Suitability of pony to rider will be emphasized. To be shown over a course of not less than six obstacles, 2' for small and medium ponies, and 2'6" for large ponies. No in and out. Two tests 1-10 are required during the first round. Only one rider per pony. The same rider/pony combination cannot compete in both the Novice and the Pony Medal Class at the same show or at the Finals in the same year. Riders may also not compete in any Medal finals that exceed 3' in the same year. Riders who win the finals twice are no longer eligible to compete in this class.

VHJA PRESIDENT'S MEDAL CLASS: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to Junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday and who are members of the VHJA. Competitors may not compete in the VHJA Junior Medal Class. To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'6" including a combination and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. One or more tests of the top 4 competitors are required. USEF Tests 1-19.

VHJA SHORT STIRRUP MEDAL: Minimum of 2 riders to complete course for a medal to be awarded. Open to all riders 12 years and under who are eligible for a Short Stirrup equitation class at the show, who are members of VHJA. To be shown over a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8 fences not exceeding 18" in height, spread not to exceed height, with one of the following options to be part of the course: a bending line or rollback turn. No combinations. Simple changes will be deemed acceptable.

VHJA GREEN MOUNTAIN TALENT SEARCH MEDAL: This is an equitation class modeled after the USEF Show Jumping Talent Search class. To be shown over a minimum of 8 jumps not to exceed 3'3". The course must include a combination, and two changes of direction. A time allowed will be figured at 360 meters per minute. A numerical score will be given, time faults will deduct one point per fault. To be judged on style and execution with an emphasis on rider's position, seat, the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Judge may require additional tests (USEF 1-19). Open to juniors and adult amateurs who are VHJA members.

VHJA YOUNG HUNTER FUTURITY: Entries must be pre-nominated and paid before the first go. Nomination fee for 2010 (which includes all horse show futurity class entries) will be \$150. VHJA will waive the nomination fee for any horse or pony adopted by any certified rescue organization (proof must be provided). Open to horses and ponies 6 years of age or younger (age advances as of January 1st of the current show year)- Horses/ponies may be of any breed or sex. Riders may be of any age; adults may ride ponies; stallions must be ridden by adults. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's/pony's mouth is required. Horses/ponies should be obedient, alert, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Martingales are not permitted. Results of each individual go will be kept secret. All placings for the year announced, ribbons given, and a monetary award of a percent of total entries, at the annual banquet.

YOUNG WORKING HUNTER: Open to horses and ponies 6 years of age or younger in their first year of showing. Riders of any age may enter- adults may ride ponies. Fences not to exceed 2'6" for horses, 2' for ponies. No combinations. To be judged on performance and soundness.

Motorized Vehicle Statement

In accordance with GR1301.7:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

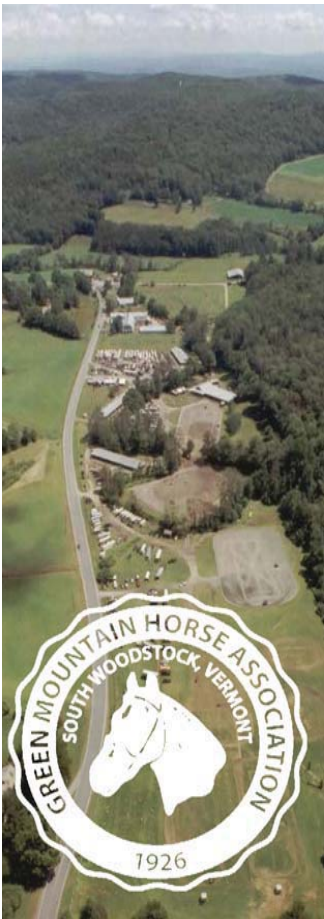
