Trail Activity Information & Policies

The following information applies to all GMHA Trail Events.

Stabling Information

- Stabling Fees are \$25/Night for GMHA Members, \$38/Night for Non-Members and are included in ride entry except where noted. Please check your ride's listing.
- There is no charge for stabling on Members' Days for members. Please check schedule. Reservations are required.
- No Bedding is provided. Bagged Shavings are available for \$10/ bag. Hay is available for \$10/bale.
- Stalls must be stripped prior to departure- \$50 dirty stall fee WILL BE CHARGED for any dirty stalls.
- GMHA assigns stalls on a first-come, first-serve basis. We will try to accommodate stabling requests, but cannot guarantee them.
- There is no turn-out available at GMHA.
- A negative coggins within 12 months must be on file in the office before any horse is unloaded on the grounds.

Entry Forms

- Please use forms provided within this Omnibus; one form per event. Additional forms may be downloaded from www.gmhainc.org
- Entries will not be accepted prior to Opening Day of Entry date (see ride info).
- Entries are considered late if postmarked, or faxed, after Closing Day (see ride info). Late entry fees should be included with entry.
- Junior riders/drivers are 17 years of age and under.
- Juniors under the age of 14 who are entering a pleasure ride must be accompanied by a riding adult at all times on trail.

Entry Confirmation

- Entries will appear on Showgroundslive.com as they are processed at GMHA. Entry status can be checked on-line.
- Entry status can also be checked by phone: (802) 457-1509
- E-mail confirmation will be sent for Competitive, Endurance, and Pleasure rides, provided a legible address has been provided.

Refunds

To encourage early registration, full refund will be given, less \$25 office fee, up until vetting-in for Competitive and Endurance events. Full refund, less \$25 office fee, will be given to Pleasure Rides prior to closing date- after closing no refunds will be given. All cancellations must be in writing. Refunds will be sent within 4 weeks of the event.

Competitive & Endurance Events

Are open to all. The Competitive events are sanctioned with the Eastern Competitive Trail Ride Association (ECTRA) and will be run under their rules. GMHA management requires that if any rider/driver, volunteer, pit crew, groom or any other person

connected with the event wishes to bring complaint of an ECTRA rule violation, for which action may be warranted, that said complaint or allegation be made in writing and given to both the ECTRA Representative and GMHA Ride Manager. Refer to ECTRA rule F-1 Event Disqualification / Elimination.

Saturday of the 15-Mile Mud Ride is not sanctioned by ECTRA but is a judged ride closely following ECTRA rules and meant to be educational. For an ECTRA rulebook, or more information on Competitive Trail, please visit: www.ectra.org.

The Endurance event is sanctioned with American Endurance Ride Conference (AERC) and co-sanctioned with ECTRA. For an AERC rulebook or more information on Endurance, please visit www.aerc.org

Vet and Farrier: Services are available on a call basis for pleasure rides, and on grounds for competitive rides. Payment arrangements are to be made directly between rider and vet & farrier.

Members' Day: Trail

Members' Days are special opportunities for MEMBERS ONLY to use GMHA's Members' Trail and grounds at NO COST! There are five fully marked Members Trail loops ranging from 5 to 15 miles long. Members' Trail is available on all dates marked as Members' Trail (see more info on pg 8). Trails may be closed due to maintenance or conditions; please call the office to confirm Members' Day status. Trails used for competitive and pleasure rides are not open on Members' Days. Those trails are used by special permission for event dates only. Members are also welcome to use the grounds on Members' Day of other disciplines, however, areas of the grounds may be closed depending on conditions and/or work necessary for events. Please RSVP for members days with the Members' Day Trail RSVP form.

Camping at GMHA

Due to Woodstock Town Ordinances, camping opportunities on the GMHA grounds are very limited. GMHA is allowed camping permits for just a few of our smaller events each year, with a limited number of camping spaces.

Camping available only for:

**June 25-Mile Ride/Drive * July 25/25/50-Mile Ride
100/60/40-Mile Ride * Endurance Ride**

Rules & Regulations:

- All campers must be GMHA members. There is no camping fee.
- All campers must be a self-contained unit- NO TENTS.
- No campfires or grills.
- No water or electricity hook ups, or generators.
- No dumping of gray water or sewage. No littering.
- No temporary paddocks or tying to trailers– horses must be stabled.
- Awnings may only be set-up AFTER all trailers have been parked- space is limited, it will be cozy!
- No loud or disorderly conduct.
- Not adhering to the above guidelines or breaking of GMHA Rules will prohibit individuals from future camping.

To sign up for camping, you **MUST** sign the release on the Competitive Trail Ride & Endurance Entry Form.

Offsite camping is also available at nearby State Parks:
Camp Plymouth, Quechee Gorge, Silver Lake, & Mount Ascutney.

About GMHA And The Trails

The Green Mountain Horse Association was founded in 1926 when a small group of riders wanted to promote the use of horses, provide facilities for horse shows and activities, and develop and maintain bridle trails in Vermont. At the time of its founding, GMHA was part of a trail network that stretched for thousands of miles from Canada through Vermont. These trails have diminished over time and GMHA is at the forefront of working to keep open miles of connecting trails in a network through public and private land use.

Below are just a few of the steps GMHA has taken to preserve trails:

- In 1997 GMHA received written permission from landowners to use and place permanent trail markers on their trails.
- Each year, GMHA organizes and oversees trail maintenance work to help keep trails open and safe. Funding for this work comes from member donations and grants.
- A Trails Investment Fund was established as part of the 2008 Capital Campaign. Monies from this fund support large scale land conservation and trail easement projects through our trail preservation program.
- In 2010, GMHA expanded its commitment to preserving bridle trails and formally initiated its Trail and Open Space Preservation Program. To date, six easements have been formalized, one is closing, and more are in negotiation.

GMHA is always looking for help in this endeavor! There are several ways you can support GMHA's ongoing efforts to preserve and protect the Trails Network:

- Please check-in at the office to confirm the status of Members' Trails. Trails may be closed due to maintenance or conditions.

Riders depart at 2 minute intervals- sign up for your time at check-in. A detailed schedule will be provided in your packet.

Food: Catered lunch is provided with entry. To ensure food availability, please pre-purchase extra tickets **WITH YOUR ENTRY** for those coming with you.

Awards: Junior, Senior, Drive, and Rookie divisions offered (rookie division may be split if entries warrant). Ribbons awarded 1-6th in each division- ties will not be broken! Overall Drive and Ride Grand Champion and Reserve also awarded.

Vetting-In 25/25/50: There will be no vetting on the morning of the ride. Vetting will be at 4-6:30pm on Friday for Saturday 25-Mile and 50-Mile, Saturday 2-5pm for Sunday 25-Mile.

Vetting In 12.5 Mile: Horses MAY vet in Saturday with 25-Milers (2-5pm) or Sunday morning at 7am. All 12.5-Mile horses MUST be on grounds by 7am Sunday.

Schedule: May not arrive prior to 1pm Friday. Pre-ride briefing for 25/25/50 will be at 6am. Drivers will depart at approx. 6:30am, riders may depart 15-minutes after the last driver departs at 2 minute intervals. Please sign-up for start times at check-in.

Pre-ride briefing for 12.5 Mile will start soon after last horse vets in, but no later than 8am. Riders depart at 8:30am at 2 minute intervals- sign up for start time at check in.

Stabling: 50-Mile entry includes Friday and Saturday night stabling; 25-Mile includes stabling for the night prior to your ride; 12.5-Mile includes use of a day stall only. Overnight stabling for 12.5-Milers, or additional nights for 25 or 50-Milers are available for purchase.

Food: Light breakfast and catered lunch is included with entry fee for THAT RIDE DAY. Please purchase extra meal tickets for your guests, or for yourself if you arrive earlier than your scheduled ride and would like lunch.

General Information:

Trail: Long and short loop options allow you to choose between 5 and 18 miles of beautiful wooded trail and country dirt roads. Weather permitting, the lunch stop will be on trail. Horse water and porta-potties are provided at lunch stops. Terrain in Vermont is hilly, so please come prepared. The trail is only open to those who have entered for that day! All trail will be marked, and may be ridden at your chosen pace.

Food: Light breakfast and catered lunch/brunch is included in every entry- be sure to check the schedule when you arrive. Please purchase lunch/brunch for guests with your entry. Friday night dinner at GMHA is included in the three day entry- please RSVP if you are planning to attend on your entry form. Single day entries, guests, and families should pre-purchase dinner ticket with entry to ensure food availability.

Schedule: Riders entering all three days may arrive after 12pm on Thursday. Single day riders with overnight stabling may arrive after 12pm on the day prior to the ride (stabling must be paid with entry).
