About Lisa Singer....



Lisa Singer began as a rider, and earned her BHSAI certificate at Porlock Vale Riding School in England. After returning to Pennsylvania, Singer began breaking Thoroughbreds and did so for 13 years. It was when she started riding a steeplechase horse for a friend who also owned a team of Welsh ponies that Singer first became interested in driving. Since that time, she has recorded countless accomplishments.

In 1994, Singer became the first female driver to win the National Pairs Championship, a title she has now won eight times. Singer again made history in 1996, when she was the first driver to win the Pairs Division Triple Crown, she repeated this feat in 1997 and 2002.

Singer has attended seven World Pair Championships, and has won the North American FEI Challenge Trophy for Pairs three times. More recently she won the Laurels this past fall after returning from World Pair Championship in Keszket, Hungary. Singer has been a driving instructor, trainer and clinician for over 30 years and has coached multiple drivers to victories in the U.S. and overseas. She is an organizer for many driving events, serves on numerous USEF committees. She likes many breeds seen in driving, but most enjoys driving Morgans.

Born in Wilmington, DE, she is the grandmother of four, and has lived on her farm, Chateau Log in Chadds Ford, PA, for more than 30 years.
