About GMHA And The Trails

The Green Mountain Horse Association was founded in 1926 when a small group of riders wanted to promote the use of horses, provide facilities for horse shows and activities, and develop and maintain bridle trails in Vermont. At the time of its founding, GMHA was part of a trail network that stretched for thousands of miles from Canada through Vermont. These trails have diminished over time and GMHA is at the forefront of working to keep open miles of connecting trails in a network through public and private land use.

Below are just a few of the steps GMHA has taken to preserve trails:

- In 1997 GMHA received written permission from landowners to use and place permanent trail markings on their trails.
- In 2004 GMHA created a Trails Coordinator position.
- In the last five years GMHA has funded extensive maintenance on private trails and fourth class roads. These funds came from grants, member contributions and the GMHA trail fund.
- A \$500,000 Trails Endowment Fund was created from the Capital Campaign.
- In 2008, the GMHA Board renewed their commitment to trails and decided to begin pursuing trail easements.
- In 2009, GMHA has secured several easements, with more in the works.
- In 2010, GMHA plans to hire a Trail Easement specialist to work specifically on securing additional easements and educating the public.

GMHA is always looking for help in this endeavor! There are several ways you can support GMHA's ongoing efforts to preserve and protect the Trails Network:

Trail Activity Information & Policies

The following information applies to all GMHA Trail Events.

Stabling Information

- Stabling Fees for 2010 (Stabling included for most rides- check your ride's listing!) are \$25/Night for GMHA Members, \$38/Night for Non-Members.
- No Bedding is provided. Bagged Shavings are available for \$10/ bag. Hay is available for \$10/bale.
- Stalls must be stripped prior to departure- \$50 dirty stall fee WILL BE CHARGED for any dirty stalls.
- GMHA assigns stalls on a first-come, first-serve basis. We will try to accommodate stabling requests, but cannot guarantee them.
- There is no turn-out available at GMHA.
- A negative coggins within 12 months must be on file in the office before any horse is unloaded on the grounds.

Refunds

Prior to closing date, full refunds will be given minus a \$50 handling fee. After the closing date, refunds will only be given (minus handling fee) with veterinarian documentation. After the event begins (start of vetting-in for competitive rides) no refunds will be given. Refunds will be sent within 2 weeks of the event.

Entry Confirmation

- Entry status can be checked at any time on Showgroundslive.com. Mail-in entries will appear on Showgrounds as they are processed at GMHA. Online entries will be accepted immediately- space will be reserved for entries mailed on opening day.
- If entering online, please be sure to mail or fax your coggins. Please note that you will need to sign your entry form when you arrive at GMHA.
- Entry status can also be checked by phone: (802) 457-1509.

Terrain

Very hilly! We try to use trail as much as possible, given weather conditions, but some parts of the rides will be on third and fourth class roads.

Competitive Rides

All of our Competitive Trail Rides are run under the rules of the Eastern Competitive Trail Ride Association (ECTRA). Although the 15-Mile Mud Ride is not sanctioned by ECTRA and is meant to be educational, we will follow their rules and procedures. For a rulebook, or more information on Competitive Trail Rides, please see the ECTRA website, www.ectra.org.

Our Endurance Ride is run under American Endurance Ride Conference rules (www.aerc.org) and is also sanctioned by ECTRA.

Here's how it works:

- You must be a **current GMHA Member**, and have signed a 2010 release form in the GMHA office.
- Your horse's **coggins must be on file** in the GMHA office before you unload.
- You **must RSVP**- please fill out and send in the Members' Day Trail RSVP & Stabling Reservations form
- Several loops of trail will be marked for your use- check in at the office for mileage and terrain information on each loop. Stop in at the office and let us know which loop you will be riding on, and your approximate time of departure. Be sure to check back in when you return.

Fees: No entry fee! Stabling: \$25/Night

NOTE: Members' Day Trail Rides will be weather dependent! They may be cancelled if conditions are too wet.

Camping at GMHA

Available only for:

June 25-Mile Ride/Drive * July 25/25/50-Mile Ride

100/60-Mile Ride * 50-Mile Endurance Ride

- All campers must be GMHA members. There is no camping fee.
- All campers must be a self-contained unit- **NO TENTS**.
- No campfires or grills.
- No water or electricity hook ups, or generators.
- No dumping of gray water or sewage. No littering.
- No temporary paddocks or tying to trailers- horses must be stabled.
- Awnings may only be set-up **AFTER** all trailers have been parked- space is limited, it will be cozy!
- No loud or disorderly conduct.
- Not adhering to the above guidelines or breaking of GMHA Rules will prohibit individuals from future camping.

To sign up for camping, you **MUST** sign the release on the Competitive Trail Ride & Endurance Entry Form.

Enter Online! Using Showgroundslive.com...

Please note: Mail-in entries still accepted- it is your option to enter online or by mail! Space will be reserved in all CTR's for opening day mail-in entries.

1. Go to www.Showgroundslive.com and click on the GMHA logo.
2. Log-in or click on "Registering here". Complete registration process if necessary.
3. Click the "Add Entry" option at the top of the screen and select your ride.
4. **Step 1: Select Horse-** If you have used showgrounds before, it will save your horse's information and you can select your horse from the pull down menu. For new users, search for your horse by name, click on the horse's name to select them. **If you and/or your horse have entered a ride at GMHA before, your information is already in the system!** If your horse's name doesn't appear, click on "Add New Horse" and enter your horse's information.
5. **Step 2: Select People.** Select the rider and owner of your horse from the pull down menus, or click "Search" button to search by name. Click on the name to select. If your name or the owner's name is not on file, create a new record for them. You don't need to enter a Trainer. **IMPORTANT- if you need stabling, you must record your stabling requests in the Notes/Requests section on this page! This includes stabling location requests, "stable with" requests, and arrival date.** Click "Next" to proceed.
6. **Step 3- Choose Classes.** All GMHA Trail Activities are listed as classes (not divisions). Select the one you wish to enter from the pull down menu and click add. Repeat the process to add additional classes/days of the ride. Click "Next".
7. **Step 4- Order Supplies.** "Supplies" includes all other fees (minus entry fees) for the ride. Select your "supplies" from the pull down menu and enter the needed quantity. If you are not a member of GMHA, you MUST select the "GMHA Non-Member Fee". **If stabling is not included in the entry fee for your ride, you must enter the fee here to reserve a stall.** Remember- your stabling location requests must go in the "Notes/Requests" section on Step 2. Click "Next".
8. **Step 5- Review Fees.** Please review your fees and note your total. Click "Next".
9. **Step 6- Deposits/Payment.** Enter your credit card information and your total charges now if you wish to pay by VISA/MASTERCARD. To pay by check, leave the amount as \$0 and click "Next"- then mail your check to GMHA. Once your check has been processed by GMHA, your account balance will be updated. Proceed through the entry process until you reach the screen that says "Thank You"- entries aren't complete until you see this screen!

Once you have entered the ride, you can log back in at any time to **make changes to your entry** (add hay, shavings, extra meal tickets, switch days of the ride, add a night of stabling, etc!).

You can also **check to see who else is riding**, how many are entered in your class, and more! **Mail-in entries will appear on Showgrounds as they are processed at GMHA.**
